Lola Rozsa

Affectionately nicknamed the "Grandmother of Calgary Golf" by local media, Lola Rozsa dedicated herself to the promotion of the game serving on the Calgary, Alberta and Canadian ladies golf associations. From the beginning in 1960 she always worked closely with players, especially juniors, taking them to tournaments and acting as a chaperone.

Lola served as president of the Calgary Ladies Golf Association from 1970-1971 and the Alberta Ladies Golf Association from 1984-1985 before serving with the Canadian Ladies Golf Association as National Teams Director in 1986. She was also a nationally accredited Rules of Golf official and in 1983 ruled at the



Commonwealth Team Matches and in 1984 at both the Canadian Junior Girls and Canadian Amateur Ladies championships.

Lola and her husband Ted moved from Texas to Calgary in 1949 and became charter members of the Canyon Meadows Golf and Country Club. Thereafter, she and Ted became members at the Calgary Golf and Country Club. Lola's first major championship was in 1960 as she helped organize the Alberta Ladies Amateur Championship at Canyon Meadows. By 1975, she became actively involved on the Calgary Golf and Country Club Ladies Section serving in various roles culminating as president from 1985-1986.
